Rio Grande LNG is a proposed liquefied natural gas (LNG) export facility. Located at the Port of Brownsville in South Texas, the Rio Grande LNG project is expected to be a leader amongst second wave United States LNG projects. The Rio Bravo pipeline is a new natural gas pipeline that will run from the Agua Dulce market area outside of Kingsville to provide natural gas to the Rio Grande LNG facility.

The Rio Grande LNG project, if approved, will be a significant investment in the people and economy in Cameron County and the surrounding areas. The project would create jobs, provide new revenue to the United States economy and provide access to low-priced natural gas to the world.

The Rio Grande LNG project is being developed by NextDecade, a Houston-based LNG development company primarily focused on LNG export projects and associated pipelines in Texas.
